I remain humbled and encouraged by the effort and dedication of our workforce volunteers and paid staff, who all demonstrate such commitment to the part each plays in keeping Lifeline at the forefront of a community striving to be suicide safe. I would also acknowledge my fellow Board Directors who take on responsibility for overseeing the financial and governance decisions required to keep the wheels turning. A new Strategic Plan for the next 5 years will be published soon after a lot of consideration by the Board and Management Team.

OLifeline remains financially stable, and our book fares and retail enterprises continue to thrive and support our crisis support staff and assist in ongoing training to ensure future needs can be met. I would also like to highlight the continued growth of local services such as Eclipse (Survivors of Suicide Attempt) Groups and the Community Kitchen. These are examples of our front-facing services provided directly to those in greatest need.

We continue working across the suicide prevention sector with the Illawarra Shoalhaven and Bega Valley Eurobodalla Suicide Prevention Collaboratives. The challenge of providing crisis services to those impacted by isolation in regional and rural communities remains a focus.

# Message from the **CEO**



## **Treasurer's Report**

The Total Comprehensive Income for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 was \$563,416 (2023: Loss \$241,733). This result included a forecast insurance recovery of \$155,910 for flood damage at the Corrimal Shop and a net gain on revaluation of property, plant and equipment of \$337,500. Excluding these unusual items, the overall financial results improved by \$311,740 with generation of additional revenue from shop and book fair sales as well as significant reductions in overall expenditure during the year.

Income generated from the sale of donated goods through our shops and the ever popular book fairs continue to provide funds to enable the valuable services provided by Lifeline South Coast to continue. The unwavering support of our volunteers has ensured that we can continue to provide important community networking hubs as well as deliver quality services to those who seek our support.

I would like to thank the staff at Lifeline South Coast and the many volunteers who work tirelessly to ensure that we can continue to provide high quality suicide prevention counselling and training to the South Coast community.
